Mathematics	Developing a strong grounding in number is essential so that all children develop the
	necessary building blocks to excel mathematically.
1. Number	 Have a deep understanding of numbers to 10 including the composition of each number.
	 Subtise (recognize quantities without counting) up to 5.
	 Automatically recall (without reference to rhymes, counting or other aids) number bonds to 10, including double facts.
2. Numerical Pattern	> Verbally count beyond 20, recognizing the pattern of the counting system.

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Kindergarten Science Curriculum

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Aims :

The aims of teaching and study of Science are to encourage and enable students to:

- 1. Develop inquiring minds and curiosity about science and the natural world.
- 2. Kindergarten will learn the basic physical science. Earth space science and also life science.
- 3. Students will learn scientific skills such as observing how to communicate effectively, as well as the scientific principles of investigation and experimentation.
- 4. Help the kids to understand that they can use science processes to learn more about the world around them.



Boa**rd Objectives:**

At the kindergarten level, emphasis is on engaging the learners in joyfully exploring the world around and harmonizing with it. The objectives at this stage are:

- 1. To nurture the curiosity of the child about the world (natural environment, artifacts and people)
- 2. To have the child engage in exploratory and hands on activities to acquire the basic cognitive and psychomotor skills through observation, classification, inference, etc.
- 3. To develop the basic language skills: speaking, reading and writing not only for science but also through science.
